PRESIDENTS REPORT

(Eddie Hawkins)

Club is 75 years old this year, welcome to the 75th AGM!

It has been an absolute pleasure being President this past year. My committee has stood up and taken their jobs by the horns. They all have worked well together and Randwick has become better for it.

When I was made President of this club, I wasn't given a crown, I was given a responsibility to bring the best out in others. I feel my committee have all worked in the right direction for the better of Randwick and the sport we all love.

At the beginning of the season we as a committee wanted to work to make Randwick feel more social and friendly so we have had some social outings. Ten pin bowling, Karma keg for Karl and some fun shoots. We still have a long way to go to make Randwick the best club in Wellington but we have made big strides and will continue in this direction.

A big thankyou to the coaches that have done coaching over the past year. Without you guys and ladies giving up your time we would not have a club. This money is used for club development and new gear.

Our JAMAs are progressing well with Anna and Richard. I have seen them improving all the time, at the least they are making friends, getting outdoors and staying away from the computers for a few hours. On the coaching front we have 3 new performance coaches with myself, Allan and Richard completing the Archery NZ performance course over the winter. We probably have more coaches at Randwick than anywhere else in the country.

Our archers competed well at the outdoor and indoor, clout NZ champs. With David and Peter making the NZ team to the world cup events. David went to the Australian open where He made it to the top four in match play. He also travelled to the Asia cup in Bangkok. Robbie was assistant coach at the recent trans-Tasman event in Auckland which NZ won.

The Randwick indoor champs again went down well and served as a good practice for the NZ indoors at Palmerston North.

This season we carried on our Tuesday night shooting indoors over the winter months where 12 archers did well in the BOP indoor comp.

We've seen a great amount of improvement in all these archers so watch out for them in the future.

Tuesday night outdoors and ANZ Postal starts this Tuesday so all welcome. Shoot the distance that suits you. But come down and meet other archers.

The big change at the range this year has been the new shooting line.

We had to replace the mower after some scumbags broke in and stole it. That was something that was not in our budget to replace, but we now have a better mower.

In the near future we will be building a roof over container 1 as money comes available.

We have just landed 6 new Elevens target butts and we will be building 6 new mobile frames. We will order 6 more Elevens butts when money becomes available. We have priced a new set of shooting lights but don't have the funds for this project so maybe next season.

As I said in the start of this report it is our 75th year, so to celebrate on Saturday 5th October 2019 we are running a Burton Shoot starting at 10am. At 6pm a prizegiving and dinner at the Larf'n Tiger on Randwick road. Cost for dinner is \$30 subsidised by the club.

TREASURERS REPORT

(Peter Emanuel)

Currently with the auditors, not expecting any major changes.

Of note from the treasurer's report:

Other income

- insurers paid out \$2700 for old mower, new mower cost \$6785

Expense

- \$10,450 for the shooting line and ground improvements
- \$3761 write off on old mower

Made a loss this year of approximately \$7900. Due mainly to shooting line which was taken as an expense, not an asset

At end of financial year, 31 July 2019 - there was \$23,000 in bank account, most of it already spent on new target butts and targets etc.

Lease - have about 3 years to go on current 5-year term and have another 5 years after that. So, we have about 8 years to go. Confident we can continue to release after that as land not able to be used by much due to so many facilities running under it.

There was general discussion around whether we could apply for grants to supplement our bigger purchases/work. We have applied in the past but not been successful, there is a lot of work involved. Not adverse to members considering this on behalf of the club, (be great to liaise with Karl Hobman if you are interested).
